Primary Literacy

Pre-School: We will continue with body percussions and the game 'Noisy Neighbour'.

Reception: We are writing lists of items we brought to the beach.

Year 1: We will be looking at poetry and beginning to prepare a poetry performance

Year 2: . We will begin to learn about calligrams.

Year 3: We will learn about poems; learning and performing them, and writing stanzas.

Year 4: We will be learning how to plan and write our own newspaper recount as a class.

Year 5: We will be writing a set of instructions for how to light a fire and how to pitch a tent.

Year 6: We will be finishing our setting description unit and completing our 'Hot Writes' about a Tsunami.

Primary Maths

Pre-School: We will continue with number 4, and count 4 objects from a set.

Reception: We are revising our knowledge of 2D shapes.

Year 1: We will be continuing to use subtraction and solve problems using it.

Year 2: We are finishing off multiplication by solving word problems using arrays and onto division by grouping.

Year 3: We will estimate numbers when adding and subtracting and using the inverse operation to check our answers.

Year 4: We will be learning how to multiply 2-digit and 3-digit numbers with remainders

Year 5: We are learning how to multiply and divide numbers by multiples of 10,100 and 1000

Year 6: We will be continuing to look at division using factors.
