**LITERACY**

**Pre-School:** We will role play the Gruffalo's Child.

**Reception:** We will begin to look at vocabulary related to the beach and what we would take to the beach.

**Year 1:** We will be continuing with our work on instructions.

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## Mothers and Babies Music Group

Research into Music and Early Years shows that singing traditional lullabies and nursery rhymes to babies and infants before they learn to speak, is an essential precursor to later educational success and emotional wellbeing. Music assists in the development of a child's speech. Singing nursery rhymes and simple songs teaches children how language is constructed and assists with the acquisition of language. Singing songs with your child will also teach them about tone, beat and rhythm. Some research shows that music and rhyme increase a child's ability in spatial reasoning, which can enhance a child's mathematical and scientific abilities. Even better than just singing, though, is to teach songs with actions and encourage your child to dance along to the music. Through these songs they will learn balance, coordination, body awareness and rhythm.

Our Mothers and Babies Music group has been regularly attended by Miral, Laila and Maverick and they have developed and progressed so well over the last month!



Maverick 11 months has learnt how to clap, reacts to singing and is experimenting with his voice. He's learning how to interact with other children too.



Miral can interact with other children now, joins in movement and actions and has grown in confidence.



Laila enjoys singing along to the music, is developing her language skills and has learnt to sing in tune with Ms Verlatto!

### Messages, Reminders & Announcements
