Children will think about the needs of a settlement, and the needs of the planet as a whole. They will find out where resource such as power and food come from, and look at ways in which natural resources can be conserved. After discussing the idea of a carbon footprint, children will have the chance to consider how their actions impact on others around the world, and to think about the changes that they could make to try to ensure that natural resources are shared so there is enough for everyone.

P.E.

Children will be introduced to PE and the PE environment at DBS Wakra. They will then concentrate on indoor athletics events such as, speed bounce, hoop throw, agility in preparation for the impending tournament.

Music

Students will be learning the foundation blocks of music theory including note naming and time signatures. Students will also be learning about the Blues and preparing for the KS2 Production.

Literacy

We will be focusing on narrative writing. The children will learn the importance of setting the scene when writing. They will also be creating their own characters, describing them in detail and bringing them to life. Atmosphere is also important in narrative writing therefore the children will be describing what the atmosphere might be like after a dramatic situation. As well as this we will identifying the key features in a report and writing our own one.
